



CAMP RULES FOR ALL ATTENDEES

- 1. The <u>Scout Law</u> is the law of the camp.
- 2. <u>Parking</u> all vehicles to be parked in designated car parks, not left on the camp sites. Trailers are permitted to remain on site near bases.
- **3.** All scouts to move around the camp and complete the activities in <u>patrols</u> decided by camp coordinator.
- 4. Scouts are to complete <u>all activities</u> to complete the Leadership Course.
- 5. First Aid during the camp will be done
 - i. Firstly, by the Patrol (if Scout)
 - ii. Next, by the Activity Base First Aider
 - iii. Then, by the designated First Aid Team at main campsite

First Aid Team must be notified of <u>ALL</u> incidents

6. <u>Curfew</u> - all Scouts should be in their tents and quiet by 10:00pm Any movement of youth members outside campsite after 10:00pm <u>must</u> be escorted by an adult member, unless going to the toilet.

Feeling Safe – Your Rights – A message for our Youth

Everyone in Scouts, youth and adults alike have the right to feel safe and be protected from abuse. No-one is allowed to threaten you, hurt you or touch you in a way that makes you feel uncomfortable, unsafe or afraid.

A Scout is respectful and this applies to all interactions between all participants, youth and adults the Leadership Course. You do not have to deal with abuse on your own. If you feel unsafe, threatened or you see/hear something that causes you concern, please speak to a leader on the activity. Your concerns will be taken seriously. The information you provide will be shared with people who can support and protect you.
